FOX CHAPEL AUTHORITY

Fox Chapel Water Authority (FCA) is a separate entity located at 255 Alpha Drive in RIDC Park that provides public water service to most residents. The Borough contracts with FCA to bill sewage for the Borough and ALCOSAN. Please call FCA for all water issues and water or sewer billing questions at 412/963-0212. As a note, FCA uses white trucks, and Borough personnel drive green vehicles.

YARD MAINTENANCE AND SAFETY

The Borough would like to remind residents of yard maintenance requirements. Please note that grass cannot exceed six (6) inches in height. Hedges and brush located in the road right-of-way along any side of the property must be trimmed back six (6) feet to allow proper sight distance and pedestrian safety. The Borough encourages residents not to plant shrubs or trees in the road right-of-way because of public safety concerns. The Borough does not maintain trees or shrubs in the right-of-way, regardless of who originally planted them. The Borough trims along the guide rails and removes tree branches that block traffic signs.

The Borough receives many complaints every year for tall grass or overgrown intersections. Intersections not cleared by residents will be removed by the Borough's contractor using a boom mower. However, the work performed by the contractor may not be to the residents' liking, so for this reason, it is recommended that the property owner clear the intersection.

TREE REMOVAL PROCESS

While planning property improvement projects, please be aware that removing any live tree, 6-inches or greater in diameter, as measured 4- ½ feet off the ground, needs to be approved by the Tree Committee. The Tree Committee has the authority to approve the removal of up to ten trees by issuing a tree removal permit. More than ten trees require the approval of the Environmental Advisory Council. A statement from a certified arborist may be required to attest to tree disease. Fox Chapel Borough encourages replacing each tree removed with a native hardwood tree.

To apply for a Tree Removal Permit, please go to the Forms/Applications area on the Borough's webpage, www.fox-chapel.pa.us. Under the Environmental Advisory Council, there is a link to the Tree Removal Permit Portal. Once the permit has been submitted, a Tree Committee member will come to your property to assess the tree(s) listed on the request form. They will then determine if the trees are permitted to be removed, and an email will be sent to the resident and contractor, as long as email addresses are provided on the form.

The trees must be marked with a ribbon and numbered. The request will be denied if the trees are not marked or identified. Permits expire one year from the date of approval.

BOROUGH RIGHT-OF-WAY

A reminder to Borough residents to refrain from placing permanent structures in the Borough right-of-way adjacent to the pavement, such as pillars, mailboxes, and other items that include sprinkler heads and invisible dog fences. Should the Borough or a utility company work along the right-of-way of your property, all items will need to be removed and not replaced. This also includes landscaping. Your cooperation is appreciated.

DRIVEWAY IMPROVEMENT PERMIT PROTECTS MOTORISTS FROM WATER RUNOFF ON BOROUGH ROADS

Since 1944, the Borough of Fox Chapel has required driveway permits for anyone installing a driveway in the Borough's right-of-way. The Borough's right-of-way is fifty (50) feet in most cases. This means about twelve (12) feet from the edge of the paving in a resident's front yard.

The right-of-way is used for underground utilities such as sewer, gas, water, cable, and stormwater piping. Anyone working within the Borough's right-of-way must call PA One Call at 811 before digging or excavating in the right-of-way or on property. Digging without a One Call risks damaging one of the buried utilities and can disrupt you or your neighbor.

The Borough regulates driveways because water from the gutter line or the driveway may be directed onto the asphalt road's surface and freeze. This can create a hazardous condition for motorists or walkers. The permit process is the Borough's way of protecting residents from accidents, and it reduces residents' liability by not allowing the driveway to create a hazardous condition.

Driveway modifications require a Driveway Improvement Permit from the Borough before starting work, such as repaving, changing the material, Grade, or drainage pattern. The Driveway Permit Application and information are available on the Borough's website. The permit fee is \$100. If you have any questions, please contact Dan Moretti at 412/850-5023.

EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT COORDINATOR - DEPUTY

The Borough of Fox Chapel seeks an Emergency Management Coordinator (EMC) Deputy. The skills an EMC Deputy needs to have include organization, management, communication, problem-solving, cultural and environmental awareness, and facilitating the recovery from natural disasters or other emergency events.

The Deputy will work closely with the Emergency Management Coordinator, Chief of Police Michael J. Stevens, in a team effort to review, update and maintain the Borough's Emergency Operations Plan. The Deputy will assist with establishing, coordinating, and managing the Borough's organization goals and objectives related to the Borough's preparedness and readiness programs that deal with disasters or crises. They will assist with establishing, coordinating, and managing risk assessment activities before, during, and after a disaster or emergency.

LEASING IN FOX CHAPEL

Any owner of property in the Borough who agrees to grant the right to occupy a property to another for residential purposes (short-term rentals are not permitted) shall, within ten days of making such an agreement, notify the Borough of the agreement, providing a copy of the agreement if it is in writing and the names of all lessees and grantees. The notice shall provide the address and telephone number of any owner, lessee, or grantee. Each change in or addition to the list shall require a new and complete notice.

TRASH & RECYCLING REMINDERS

Vogel and the Borough would like to remind residents of the following:

- Recyclables with food waste should be rinsed before being placed in the recycling container. Materials with food contaminants, such as grease or melted cheese, are not recyclable and should be placed in the trash container.
- Cardboard must be flattened or broken into pieces no larger than four (4) feet. Any packing material such as Styrofoam blocks, peanuts, or bubble wrap must be removed.
- If it rains on the collection day, ensure cardboard and paper materials do not become wet by placing them in the Borough-issued recycling container with a lid. Wet cardboard and paper materials are not recyclable.
- Recycling should be loose, not bagged, and placed within the Borough-provided green container. Plastic bags are not
 recyclable. Plastic bags get tangled in recycling equipment, causing the facility to shut down to cut plastic bags free
 from the machinery. This reduces efficiency and endangers workers at the facility. As such, Vogel will not pick up any
 recyclables in plastic bags.
- Contractor Bags are not to be used even if they weigh less than 45 pounds.
- Garbage bags should not exceed 33 gallons and 45 pounds and must be tied shut.
- Shredded paper needs to be bagged with trash. It cannot be loose in the recycling container.
- Garbage calls should be directed to Vogel Disposal Service at 855-494-3345.

A letter from the Borough and Vogel Disposal Service was sent to all residents of the Borough in late May regarding frequently asked questions and concerns about collection. This letter and information on trash & recycling are available on the website.

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE AND E-WASTE COLLECTION

Household hazardous waste and electronic waste collection are by appointment only, with the following date remaining for collection in 2022; September 12, 2022. Contact Vogel Disposal Service, Inc.'s Customer Service Department, 855/494-3345, to schedule at least ten business days before the collection date. Please be prepared with detailed information about the products you request be picked up during the call. You will need the following information for Hazardous Household Waste: the brand name, container size, quantity remaining in the container, and possible information from the label. For Electronic Waste, you will need the brand name, screen size, style, and approximate weight. NO DUMPING!

In the past few months, the Borough Public Works Department has had to collect illegal brush dumping in the Fox Chapel Parks. The Borough would like to remind all residents that placing brush such as leaves, sticks, and other yard debris on Borough property is illegal and, if caught, can lead to a fine from the Police Department.

BE INFORMED - SIGN UP FOR FOX CHAPEL ALERT!

The Borough of Fox Chapel has adopted Fox Chapel Alert powered by Smart 911 to replace Nixle Emergency and Community Notification System.

The Borough intends to use Fox Chapel Alert to communicate with residents about extreme weather, road closures, public health and safety concerns, bulletins for dangerous situations, and community event notifications. Fox Chapel Alert replaces the current system and will allow for customization, such as multilingual translations, population segmentation, and location-based information.

Over the past two years, it became clear the Borough needed a streamlined and customizable way to share updates with residents across the Borough of Fox Chapel. Our deployment of Fox Chapel Alert allows us to notify the community quickly and confidently deliver the right message to the right people when it matters most.

Subscribers can set notification preferences for where they receive alerts (SMS text, push notification, email, or voice message) and for the type of alert, ranging from emergency alerts, special events, and traffic updates.

WILDLIFE CALLS


