Environmental Disturbance Application 23-04

Dennis J. & Colleen Steigerwalt Submitted by Hampton Technical Associates 123 Pasadena Drive South Construction of a Single-Family Dwelling

The EAC recommends approval of Environmental Disturbance Application No. 23-04 as submitted with the recommendation that a revised replanting plan be submitted in the future with consideration of the suggestions made by the EAC. Also, with the granting of a waiver of the requirement for a geotechnical report and the granting of a waiver on the limitation of 15% for the disturbance of very steep slopes with low risk, permitting disturbance of up to 20.07%.

## **CONTRACT AWARD**

Roadway Aggregates

The Borough purchases specific aggregates not bid by SHACOG. Three bids were received from McClymonds Supply & Transit Co., Inc., Glacial Sand & Gravel Co., and Vigliotti Landscaping & Construction for River Gravel,

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No. 8 Pea Gravel, fine mason sand, and fill sand as required by the Borough from March 21, 2023, to April 30, 2024. The bids were opened at 10 AM at the Borough Building on March 16, 2023, with Gary Koehler, Shawn Peterson, and a Vigliotti Landscaping & Construction representative present.

It is recommended to award the contract to Glacial Sand & Gravel Co. as the low bidder and McClymonds Supply & Transit Co., Inc. as the second lowest bidder (depending on the material availability during the winter season).

## Contract No. 23-R02 - 2023 Road Maintenance - Crack Sealing

Award contract to U.S. Municipal for three Dinkmar Standard 9' Leaf Boxes via CoStars Contract No. 025-E22-441 for \$33,201. The 2023 Budget includes \$36,000 for the boxes.

## Service Order Authorization (SOA) – Sanitary Sewer System – A-7802 Sycamore Run H&H Model & Alternatives Analysis Update

LSSE was requested to update the Hydrologic and Hydraulic (H&H) Model to give an initial determination of which updates will need to be made and what data will be utilized for the sewer system upgrades. This data will determine the collector line size needed in Hardie Valley Park and subsequent tasks.

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Authorize the SOA for LSSE to proceed with the Engineering Services related to the A-7802 sewershed at the cost of \$32,600. The Sewer Fund is available for this expenditure.

Bids were received on Municibid for the Sefac Model 1200 M68 Truck Lift sale. It is recommended to award the sale of the truck lift to the high-bidder, Rob Wallace, at \$10,300.

At February 20, 2023, Council meeting, Council tabled this item and asked Gary Koehler and Michael Stevens to look at other high-priority roads in the Borough that are recommended to be changed based on public safety to see if the issues are similar to the ones faced with Woodland Farms Road.

Chief Stevens was asked to meet with Eva Malecki, a resident at 75 Woodland Farms Road with an engineering background, to see if there is a way to update the Law Enforcement Computer Aided Dispatch (CAD) System to give real-time voice directions to first responders. Chief Stevens will provide an update.
